The software produces reports that provide patients with actionable suggestions to better address their oral health care needs.

In 2006, Americans made about 500 million visits to dentists, and an estimated \$94 billion was spent on dental services.² “It’s estimated that every \$1 spent on preventive dental care could save \$8 to \$50 in restorative and emergency treatments,³” said Hall. “The savings could increase when you factor in potential costs related to medical treatment for illness resulting from poor oral hygiene.”

“Intervention and treatment can help to improve periodontal disease as well as reduce the risk of an associated systemic condition such as heart disease or diabetes,” said Dr. Robert Genco, a member of CIGNA Dental Clinical Advisory Panel. “Successful intervention requires patient compliance. As a result, dental providers must continue to consider innovative tools that simplify the diagnosis and treatment planning process and increase patient awareness.”
